CONCEPT NOTE ON

THE LAUNCH OF THE CONRAD N HILTON FOUNDATION PROJECT

1. 0 Introduction

The Ministry of Water and Environment (MWE), through the Directorate of Water Resources Management (DWRM), has been implementing Catchment Based Water Resources Management (CBWRM) in the Albert Water Management Zone (AWMZ) since 2011.

The implementation approach of CbWRM in the AWMZ has been hinged on the development of Catchment Management Plans (CMPs). Therefore, the developed CMPs highlight hotspot areas where catchment management measures can be implemented as well as possible mitigation and adaptation measures aimed at catchment restoration and livelihood enhancement.

In this regard, Mpanga CMP was developed in 2015 and highlighted challenges such as limited and unreliable availability of essential data, unsustainable land use practices (deforestation, overgrazing, agriculture), river bank lakeshore and wetland degradation, siltation of water bodies, deteriorating quality and quantity of river waters, and weak institutional capacity and weak governance structures for water resources management for water resources management.

In 2016, the Albert Water Management Zone, in liaison with the key catchment stakeholders prioritized the implementation of catchment management measures in the upstream Mpanga in Kabarole District where communities were trained in soil and water conservation and Tree growing in Nyakitokoli, Kibwa, and Kamabale Parishes; Establishment of Nursery bed at Mountains of the Moon University in Saaka village and at Kazingo primary school in Bukuku sub-county; Midstream in Kyenjojo where communities were trained in nursery bed establishment and Tree planting in Kigaraale, Butiiti and Nyabuharwa Sub-counties), and downstream in Kamwenge (restoration of Mutamba wetland and promotion of wetland friendly activities like Aquaculture in Kahungye Sub-county).

The Government of Uganda has continuously scaled up the catchment management measures such Tree growing and also promoted Alternative income-generating activities such as ;Apiary, Energy saving cook stoves and Fruit growing) within Mpanga Catchment in Karangura ,Kabambiro Sub-County and Kabuga Town Council.

The mitigation (nature-based solutions) and adaptation (Alternative income generating activities) measures implemented have since then impacted the catchment area in terms of improved water quantity/quality and enhanced livelihoods.

Over the past years, MWE's interventions within the catchment have attracted other actors like Join for Water, Water for People, Joint Effort to Save Environment, Natural Resources Defence Initiatives, Iles de Paix, NAADS among others. It is upon this background that the Ministry of Water and Environment has initiated memorandums of understanding with various water and environment resources practitioners in the Albertine region. MoUs have been developed with institutions and NGOs such as; Tooro Kingdom, Water for People among others.

2.0 MWE-Water for People Partnership

Water for People a region-based NGO which promotes sustainable WASH practices through collaboration with the Ministry of Water and Environment adopted the Catchment Based Water Resources Management approach in 2012. Water For People has supported Albert Water Management zone in delivering its mandate with Conrad N Hilton funding as follows; establishment of a weather station (rain gauge) at Kabambiro Primary School in Kamwenge, installation of Groundwater divers in Kabambiro Sub-county, Groundwater and Surface water monitoring stations constructed at River Rushango, restoration of river banks, wetlands and livelihood enhancement for the vital ecosystem frontline communities in Kabuga Town council. Following the previously highlighted achievements, MWE-AWMZ deemed it necessary to team up with Water for People and generate a proposal to scale up the Mpanga catchment interventions aimed at sustainable management of the ecosystem. This year, the Albert Water Management Zone has secured the Conrad N Hilton Grant to facilitate the implementation of catchment-based Water Resources in five riparian districts of R. Mpanga. Similarly, Water for People and Join for Water received funding to; facilitate knowledge management interventions in five riparian districts of the river Mpanga catchment in form of learning and reflection sessions, learning journeys, documentation of the water resources management best practices and experiences as well as related knowledge assessments and to digitally map the wetland & riparian zone and develop wetland/riverbank management plan and strategy respectively.

2.1 Overview of Conrad Hilton Foundation Project

The Conrad N. Hilton Foundation pursues approaches that touch a diversity of people, places and needs. Safe water is one of the seven program areas of focus in three countries including;

Ethiopia, Ghana and Uganda. The Foundation's approach is aligned with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goal 6.1: By 2030, achieve universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water for all and also focuses on issues beyond infrastructure to address systemic challenges related to Safe Water, including water resources management, climate change, policy and regulatory frameworks, and data systems, among others.

Currently, the Ministry of Water and Environment through the AWMZ has received the Conrad N Hilton Foundation grant to facilitate the implementation of Catchment based Water Resources in five riparian districts of R. Mpanga (Kabarole, Kamwenge, Ibanda, Kitagwenda and Kyenjojo) aimed at improving watershed management in the catchment. The interventions will align with the AWMZ's mandate to implement its core activities in areas of water quantity and quality monitoring and implementation of catchment-based restoration measures. The project will be implemented in three years that is 2024-2026.

2.1 Project Objectives

2.1.1 Main Objective

To implement watershed management and nature-based water conservation activities within the Mpanga Catchment

2.1.2 Specific Objectives

- Support capacity building of catchment management organizations for better institutional processes, planning and management through trainings
- ii. Strengthening the capacity of the AWMZ staff in their role as the primary coordinating entity through building skills in carrying out work planning and monitoring including technical tests for better implementation
- iii. Support the restoration and implementation of priority catchment management measures by using nature based solutions in the districts of Kamwenge, Kabarole, Kyenjojo and Ibanda
- iv. Showcasing AWMZ as a model of catchment based water resources management through institutional cooperation and publication of work success stories from mpanga catchment

2.2 Project Outcomes

- a) Restoration of degraded landscapes through afforestation on private and public land
 - 180Ha in Kabarole, Kyenjojo and Ibanda districts
 - 500 households to be trained
- b) Restoration of wetland systems and their buffer zones demarcated
 - 120Hactares in Kamwenge & kyenjojo.
 - 400 community people to be trained on the importance of wetland restoration
 - c) Soil and Water Conservation
 - 150 community individuals to benefit in flood and soil erosion control measures
 - 2km of soil to be established and stabilized in upstream
 - Establish 10 percolation and infiltration pits in upstream
 - e) Installation of 1 mini weather station
 - f) A newly constructed hydro-monitoring station at mpanga catchment outlet
